

Wild Population Status and Trade Dynamics of Ikan Napoleon (Humphead Wrasse – HHW) *Cheilinus undulatus* in Indonesia

MEETING OBJECTIVES:

- 1) To present findings of the research conducted by IUCN and TRAFFIC regarding wild population status and trade dynamics in Indonesia, and to review this information while clarifying data and bridging information gaps;
- 2) To allow provincial representatives of DKP and KSDA to present their assessment of Ikan Napoleon harvest and trade in their jurisdictions, and to identify and promote models for better inter-agency collaboration at provincial level as well as provincial-central levels;
- 3) To discuss methodology for improved monitoring of wild populations, harvest and trade (within Indonesia, as well as international trade) of Ikan Napoleon, including chain(s) of custody;
- 4) To identify complementary programmes/projects within Indonesia relevant to the management and awareness-raising of HHW
- 5) To develop a 'risk assessment' checklist that will outline protocols for non-detriment findings and determination of annual quotas at national and provincial levels.

EXPECTED OUTPUTS:

- 1) IUCN/TRAFFIC report data clarified and further elaborated;
- 2) Draft 'risk assessment' checklist for HHW harvest and trade;
- 3) Draft procedures for NDF methodology on HHW;
- 4) Inter-agency procedures clarified for policy, monitoring, law enforcement and general communications and information-sharing between Indonesian government and scientific agencies for the management of HHW harvest and trade.
- 5) Collaboration with existing programmes on coral reef resources/fishes to expand awareness and management of HHW in Indonesia**
